LaGrange City Council Members Norma Tucker and Nick Woodson to Retire

LaGrange, Ga. January 4, 2018 – On Tuesday January 9th, City Councilwoman Norma Tucker and City Councilman Nick Woodson will retire from the board.

Norma Tucker served the City of LaGrange for twelve years, or three terms.

Nick Woodson served for twenty years, or five terms.

Tucker is only the second woman to serve on the LaGrange City Council in the more than 180 years the board has been in existence.

Former City Councilwoman Kay Durand was the first female to serve on the board. She spoke on behalf of Tucker at Tucker's last City Council meeting December 21st.

"Norma, thank you so much for your twelve years of service to the City of LaGrange," Durand said.

“As a female, I could not be prouder of the work that you have done. Thank you so much for everything you’ve accomplished.”

“It’s been a blessing to represent the City of LaGrange and the community. I pray that I’ve been a blessing to others as everyone has been to me,” Tucker said.

“Thank you LaGrange and thank you to everyone who has worked to help me be the best possible leader I can be.”
